The average time for clearance after arrival is approximately 1-2 days.</p> <p><u>Sea Shipments</u> All sea shipments undergo a physical Customs inspection. The average time for clearance after arrival is 3-7 working days.</p>	<p>It is highly recommended that the shipper be in Mongolia during the clearance process as customs officials on occasion do not accept notarized copies and may demand to meet with the shipper and verify the original documents; e.g.: passport, residence permit.</p>
<p><b>Prohibited items</b></p>			<p>Narcotics, drugs, pornographic materials, alcohols and spirits of more than 75% alcohol content, chemicals and toxic materials.</p>

<p><b>Others</b></p>	<p>SPECIAL ITEMS (e.g. Rifles, Stuffed Animals, etc.)            Rifles and firearms: Several import permits are required depending on the type of firearm to be imported.            Stuffed animals:            • CITES certificate</p> <p>ANTIQUES, ARTIFACTS, CARPETS, PAINTINGS            No special permits are needed for import of these items. As long as they are used and for personal use and will not be sold in Mongolia and an acceptable quantity, they can be imported duty free. The number of carpets, paintings, artwork and antiques should be in proportion to the items being imported. A valued inventory or purchase invoice is required for these items.</p>		
<p><b>Motor vehicles</b></p>	<p>Documents required for import customs clearance are the same as for household goods, plus:            • Original invoice of the vehicle            • Certificate of title            • Parameters of the vehicle (year of manufacture, make, model, type, volumetric capacity of the engine, engine number, chassis number, petrol or diesel). They are subject to a substantial government tax. The original purchase invoice and insurance certificate are required.</p>	<p>Duties and taxes on the imported vehicle are to be paid.</p>

Liquor , Wine, Tobacco		<p>Allowance for duty free import of alcoholic beverages and tobacco products for personal consumption is            Wine: 2 liters Cigarettes: 200 pcs            Beer: 3 liters Cigars: 50 pcs            Vodka: 1 liter Tobacco: 250 grams</p> <p>Above these amounts several special permits are to be obtained and excise tax to be paid.            Amount of excise tax is as follows:            Vodka: USD 5.00 - 6.00 per liter            Beer: USD 0.20 per liter            Wine: USD 1.50 - 6.00 per liter            Cigarettes: USD 0.60 per every 100 pcs            Tobacco: USD 0.30 per kg.</p>	
Life animals	<p>Documents required for importing a pet to Mongolia are the same as for household goods plus:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stamped health certificate issued by a government veterinarian in the origin country, showing the name, sex and breed of the pet, as well as all vaccination records.</li> <li>• Owner's passport with residence permit (original).</li> </ul> <p>Quarantine may be required depending on the type of animal and the country of origin.</p>
